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<p><b>Making Judgements</b></p>	<p>Global Law graduates will learn to recognize and interpret worldwide legal phenomena in order to independently understand how they are regulated on the basis of the legal principles and rules acquired. In particular, through courses that foster skill acquisition in the fundamentals of juridical method, graduates will develop critical competencies that may be applied in ever-changing contexts of varying complexity.</p>
<p><b>Communication</b></p>	<p>Global Law graduates will develop the ability to communicate both in writing and orally (face-to-face or in front of an audience) by attending course-related lectures, completing assignments required by the faculty and taking exams. Furthermore, their skills will be sharpened thanks to mandatory attendance to academic seminars for soft skills development on topics including advocacy, public speaking, negotiation and legal writing. Global Law graduates will also have the opportunity to further enrich their language skills with professional activities, participating in one of two "Law in Action" experiences as required by their program, in either a legal clinic or internship abroad. Finally, sharing a classroom with students from all over the world, in addition to writing the final paper, will encourage graduates to communicate better.</p>
