PLOT

The story follows the plot of Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet but is set in the slums of New York in the 1950's. Tony, a poor white Polish boy, and Maria, a poor newly arrived Puerto Rican girl, fall in love with the intensity that only young people can feel. Unfortunately, Tony is an ex-member of the Jets, a gang of poor white ghetto kids (white trash); and his best friend, Riff, is the leader of the gang. Maria is the sister of Bernardo, the leader of the rival Puerto Rican gang, the Sharks. All the characters live in a neighborhood that is about to be destroyed because of property speculation but they are so trapped in their difficult lives that they are not able to see what is happening around them. The story, which was originally a Broadway musical, has lost nothing of its of its freshness, in that poor ethnic groups, in this case white and Hispanic, are still cornered now in their poverty and their pasts. When it opened in 1957, New York was the art capital and modern dance capital of the world; the music and songs serve to greatly heighten the tragedy.

LANGUAGE

Originally a Broadway musical, the language adapts the slum talk of the 50's to make it understandable for a sophisticated educated theatre-going public.
