

STUDENT-FACULTY JOINT TEACHING COMMITTEES REGULATIONS

Art. 1 – Area of Application

1.
These regulations, in accordance with the Statute and General University Rules (Regolamento Generale di Ateneo, RGA) of Bocconi University, and within the applicable legislative framework governing private universities, define the operations, activities and resources of the Student-Faculty Joint Teaching Committees (hereinafter referred to as CPDS).

Art. 2 – Appointment, term of assignment and renewal of members

1.
Faculty members are typically appointed from among those who are currently, or have been in the last two years, course directors of compulsory courses within the specific study programs in question.
The term of assignment for faculty members is three years, with varying expiration dates as specified in the appointment decree, to ensure the methodological and operational continuity of the body.
Students members are appointed from among class representatives elected within the relevant study program. Typically, student representatives are nominated as follows: second-year Bachelor students, first-year Master of Science students, and second-, third-, or fourth-year Integrated Master of Arts students, excluding those who have been elected as representatives on the Study Program Committees. When determining the candidate roster, the Deans consider any spontaneous applications from elected class representatives. The term of assignment for student members is two years.

Art. 3 – Organizing and Functioning

The operational procedures of the body are subject to the general terms contained in the General University Rules.

CPDS are responsible for:

- Carrying out monitoring activities related to the educational offerings, teaching quality and student services provided by the faculty;
- Identifying indicators useful for evaluating the outcomes of monitoring activities;
- providing feedback concerning the activation and deactivation of

- study programs;
- Drafting an annual report that includes proposals to the University Evaluation Unit aimed at improving the quality and efficiency of study programs, in alignment with the learning outcomes;
 - Carrying out other responsibilities as assigned by university regulations, where applicable.

The Committees carry operate by grouping first- and second-level degree programs within similar disciplinary areas, as identified in the Rectoral decree of appointment and establishment.

They are composed of an equal number of faculty and student representatives, with the total number of members being equal to the number of active degree programs, as selected based on proposals from the Deans of the Schools.
