Cambridge English Proficiency consists of four papers developed to test your English skills at a C2 level. It is necessary to pass all four parts in order to pass the examination:

Paper	Content	Purpose
Reading and Use of English (1 hour 30 minutes)	7 parts 53 questions	Shows you can deal confidently with different types of text, such as fiction and non-fiction books, journals, newspapers and manuals.
Writing (1 hour 30 minutes)	2 parts	Requires you to be able to write a variety of text types, such as essays, reports and reviews.
Listening (about 40 minutes)	4 parts 30 questions	Requires you to be able to follow and understand a range of spoken materials, such as lectures, speeches and interviews.
