PLOT

In Motaba River Valley, Zaire, in 1967, there is an outbreak of a virus with a 100% mortality rate. The entire region is contaminated and a devastatingly huge fire bomb is dropped onto the area in order to reduce the chances of further infection.

27 years later, in 1994, there is another outbreak in Motaba River Valley. Colonel Sam Daniels (Dustin Hoffman) of the United States Army Research Institute of Infectious Diseases (USARIID) is doing research on the virus, and so is his ex-wife (Rene Russo), who works at the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in Atlanta, Georgia.

A monkey carrying the deadly Motaba virus is smuggled into the U.S.A. by ship and the greatest medical crisis in the world is about to happen. Extreme measures are necessary to contain this fatal epidemic. But exactly how extreme? Try to remain calm.
